ST. PETER'S LUTHERAN SCHOOL NEWS



December has ended or soon will be over. A new year is beginning for our calendar. But our school year is less than half over. Yes, we have lots of things that are completed, that are ended, but we look forward to so much more before our school year finally ends in early June. What has been accomplished so far in this school year? We have had some staff changes with Mr. Rogers taking over the 5th grade classroom, Mrs. Gehri taking a maternity leave, Miss Meyer filling in as a long term sub, Mrs. Braun replacing Mrs. Klitzke in 3rd grade, and myself coming out of retirement to fill in as Principal for a period of time.

Our enrollment has maintained and even grown over last year. We have 2 three year old pre-K classes with 10 students each and 1 four year old class with 17 students. Our classes in K – 8 range from 8 in grade 8 to 22 in grade 1 with an overall average of just over 16 students per classroom. Thus our total enrollment right now is 184.

Over the past few months many staff, and parents, and congregational members have put in many hours reviewing and recording and updating information on our school as the various committees have been looking at the National Lutheran School Accreditation process for St. Peters. The work is wrapping up so we can have our school visit in March and hopefully have our accreditation renewed in 2015. This process is just a wonderful way that we can find any weaknesses in our school and work to improve them. We can also see our strengths and strive to keep them strong and even make them stronger.

Our volleyball season ended and now we are in the middle of the basketball season. We have students who are in band and orchestra with the Webb Middle School students and are transported by parents or school staff to practices every week. So about 80% of our students in grades 5-8 are busy with other activities outside of the classroom. When we add in the choirs that practice during the school time and the bell choirs that also practice during school time, we have 100% of the student body that are involved in activities in and out of the

classroom. What a wonderful opportunity to share Christ in our lives throughout the school year. These are a few of the things that have been done and are continuing. But there is so much more that will be happening in the weeks and months to come. Jump rope contest in Bloomer happens in January along with our annual Spaghetti Dinner fund raiser. February brings another Book Fair. March is highlighted with our celebration of National Lutheran Schools Week and the Pancake Breakfast fund raiser.

April is highlighted with our Spring break and Iowa Test of Basic Skills testing. The big thing in May is confirmation and June wraps everything up with graduation and moving into the summer break.

Throughout the school year we are working on next school year looking at questions on staffing, enrollment, curriculum, supplies and many other things that need to be examined. So the school year does not end with December but is an ongoing process. And we are blessed by your support as we continue this special ministry of St. Peters Lutheran School. THANK YOU!

St. Peter's Basketball B-Team Updates and Highlights

The Boy's Basketball season kicked off with the first practice held on November 3rd and features 17 boys in grades 5th through 8th participating. There are two teams "B-Team" and A-Team".

The B-Team consists of 5th graders – Hunter Brekke, Sam Raupp, Joshua Thomas, Nicholas VanEtten and Bracen Brandt. 6th graders, Gunnar Glick, Hayden Thomas, Eric Peterson, Connor Klitzke, Jacob Defoe and Keith Curtin. The B-Team is coached by Scott Peterson and Tim Thomas.

On Tuesday, November 25th, the boys started the season with a game versus St. Pat's, Mauston. The B-Team boys played an extremely entertaining game exchanging baskets and defensive stops and coming from behind and notching a double overtime victory on a second overtime game winning shot by Keith Curtin. The game featured balance scoring and solid defense. Keith Curtin, Hayden Thomas, Nicolas VanEtten, Hunter Brekke, and Eric Peterson all notched baskets in a memorable 16-15 victory.

On Tuesday, December 2nd, the B-Team boys traveled to St. Mary's in Portage. The B-Team boys started the game out strong on the offensive and defensive front and was led by the inside sharp shooting of Jacob Defoe and lock down physical defense of Gunnar Glick, whose inspired defense rubbed off on his teammates and led them to an excellent defensive display, taking a 17-4 lead at the half. The second half featured a no quit St. Mary's team who toughened up on defense and got within 4 points before Nicholas VanEtten drained a perimeter shot which sealed the victory en route to a 27-18 final. The game featured balance scoring with baskets coming from Jacob Defoe, Keith Curtin, Joshua Thomas, Bracen Brandt, and Nicholas VanEtten who drained a long range three. Connor Klitzke earned a well deserved trip to the free throw line with a powerful inside move and

Sam Raupp had a beautiful assist to contribute to the victory.

On Tuesday, December 9th, the boys played at home versus cross town rival Sacred Heart. The boys played lock tight defense in a battle of unbeaten and did a great job holding the high scoring Sacred Heart to 8 points in the first half. The defense continued its pressure and held them to 6 points in the second half, resulting in a season best, limiting them to 14 points total. Offensively, Gunnar Glick scored his first point, joining Keith Curtin and Joshua Thomas in the scoring column for a total of 7 points. The 7 points weren't enough and the Tigers lost 7-14. There were many great take away's from the loss and the boys never gave up.

On December 16th the Tigers faced off against St. Johns of Baraboo. St. Johns jumped out to a 6-13 halftime lead and after a inspired half time the boys doubled their first half point total and pulled within 4 with 2 minutes remaining, but it wasn't enough and lost 18-26. Leading the scoring was Keith Curtin with 8 and featured scoring by Hayden Thomas, Eric Peterson, Hunter Brekke and Nick VanEtten.

On 12-18 we traveled to St. Joes in Baraboo and the defense was the highlight, holding them to 6 first half points en route to a 20-14 victory to improve our road record to 3-0. The team was led by Nick VanEtten with 5 points and featured scoring by Keith Curtin, Hayden Thomas, Joshua Thomas, Bracen Brandt, Hunter Brekke and Conner Klitzke who scored his first points of the season.

Our next games are at home on January 6th against St. Pats and January 19th against St. Mary's. On January 20th we travel to Sacred Heart and wrap up the month with home games against St. Joes on January 22nd and St. Johns on January 27th. The B-Boy's game tips off at 5:00 p.m. followed by the A-Team Boys. We encourage you to join in the excitement of the basketball season and come out to support your Tigers!! Concession will be available and the fellowship is always free!
