

The annual Pancake Breakfast will be held on March 1, the first day of Lutheran Schools Week. There will also be another Book Fair which will be from February 25 to March 1.


Lots of Lutheran Schools Week activities will be held. Watch for more information about all the activities as the time gets closer.



# Sports News

On December 16<sup>th</sup> the Tigers had a home game and faced off against St. Johns of Baraboo. St. Johns jumped out to a 6-13 halftime lead by the Tiger Boys came out inspired in the second half and a Keith Curtin layup closed the gap to 4 with 2 minutes remaining, but it wasn't enough as the Tigers lost 18-26. Leading the scoring was Keith Curtin with 8 and featured scoring by Hayden Thomas, Eric Peterson, Hunter Brekke and Nicholas VanEtten.

On December 18<sup>th</sup> the boys traveled to St. Joes in Baraboo and the defense was the highlight of the night, holding them to 6 first half points en route to a 20-14 victory which improved our road record to 3-0 on the season. The team was led by Nicholas VanEtten with 5 points and featured balanced scoring by Keith Curtin, Hayden Thomas, Joshua Thomas, Bracen Brandt, Hunter Brekke and Conner Klitzke who scored his first points of the season.

On December 23<sup>rd</sup> the boys traveled to St. Johns Portage and featured a game that was filled with suspense and excitement. The first half ended with our Tigers down 8-12 and at halftime took control and a 6 point lead with 3 minutes remaining. Hunter Brekke led the scoring charge who went on a second half 7 point scoring surge. St. Johns did not give up and regained the lead and a five point lead with 1 minute remaining, the team did not quit and Hunter Brekke earned a trip to the charity stripe and hit one of two free throws to pull within 4, grabbed his missed rebound and found a open Bracen Brandt under the bucket, Bracen's shot edged of the rim and St. Johns ran out the clock and earned a 19-23 victory. The team was led with Hunter Brekke with 9 points and featured scoring

by Bracen Brandt, Nicholas VanEtten, Gunnar Glick and Keith Curtin.

On January 6<sup>th</sup> the Tiger's returned from Christmas break looking for their first home court victory of the season, matching up with a St. Pat's (Mauston) team who was looking to avenge their home opening double overtime of the loss to start the season. The first half featured a neck and neck basket for basket exchange and saw the Tigers take a 8-7 half time lead. Out of the half the Tigers went on a scoring attack with baskets being made by Keith Curtin, Joshua Thomas, Gunnar Glick and Bracen Brandt, St. Pats fought until the end and with 45 seconds remaining Joshua Thomas earned a trip to the charity stripe and sealed the victory with his rebound and lay in putting the Tigers up en route to a 21-13 victory. Keith Curtin led all scorers with 10 points, joining Joshua, Gunner, Bracen and Nicholas VanEtten in the scoring column.

The Tigers enter the second half of the season with a 4-3 record and have 5 games remaining. Please come and show your Tiger Pride and join us for one of our remaining home games on January 19<sup>th</sup> against St. Johns Baraboo, January 22<sup>nd</sup> St. Joes and our home finale on February 3<sup>rd</sup> against St. Johns Portage. Our final game of the season will be parents night. Road games remaining include Sacred Heart Reedsburg on January 20<sup>th</sup> and St. Johns Baraboo on January 22<sup>nd</sup>. Games start at 5:00 and delicious concessions and half time surprises await.

Watch for upcoming promotional events sponsored by the Student Council and pack our gym for the final games of the boys and girls season and show your Tiger Pride. On February 3<sup>rd</sup> at 2:30 there will be a Boys and Girls Basketball Pep Rally in the gym and games on February 3<sup>rd</sup> and February 5<sup>th</sup>.



I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your prayerful and financial support of Christian Counseling through Lutheran Counseling and Family Services. It has been an honor to work here in this Christian Community and to watch the Gospel of Jesus change lives.

Therapy can be a place to look deeply at one's life and mind in light of God's Word. It is an opportunity to reflect on and answer such questions as "What in my life needs correction?" "What needs grace and healing?" The changes one experiences through this process are not limited to external behaviors; one's heart and mind are also shaped by God's Word and His Grace. These deep personal changes produce organic changes in the person's life, work, friendships, parenting, marriage, community and how one ministers to others for Christ's sake. This life, now more deeply shaped by God, has positive consequences for future generations. These generations can watch and benefit from what God has done in the person's life through the trial that brought them to counseling. I have seen this play out in reality on many occasions, right here at St. Peter's.

**"Endure hardship as discipline, God is treating you as sons. . . No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it." Hebrews 12:7 & 11**

The following story happened years ago, but it is a good example of the kinds of things God has done here at St. Peter's, in this time and at this place. A certain woman deliberately engaged in a hidden, sinful, broken lifestyle which fractured her family. Decades later, she fully repented to God, but felt stuck in guilt and shame for years and years. In the Christian counseling setting she was able to fully open this up and was assured of God's grace and forgiveness. Consequently she was able to talk to her pastor about this also. This healing and God's power enabled her to live her life without the shackles of guilt: free to make positive changes in her relationships with her adult children and her grandchildren for Christ's sake. Without the strict confidentiality inherent in the counseling relationship, she might never have shared this with any other Christian. She might have missed out on the assurance of the grace of Christ and the power to live without crippling guilt. "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective." James 5:16

Stories like this, of healing and growth are common. Thank you for supporting and being a part of this good work.
